Course Overview:

- Training considerations
- Commander's responsibilities for SWAT OIS
- Current issues
- Documentation
- Tactical strategy & operational tempo
- High risk warrant service, barricaded subject, & hostage rescue considerations
- Incident debriefs

Instructor Bio:

Wayne DuBois – A police sergeant with more than 21 years of law enforcement experience and active SWAT team member for 20 years. During his career, Wayne has responded to and/or supervised hundreds of critical incidents, including several hundred barricaded suspects, armed suicidal subjects, and hostage situations. Prior to law enforcement, Wayne served 4 years on active duty as a ground surveillance systems operator in the U.S. Army, including deployment to Southwest Asia for 6 months during Operation Desert Shield/Storm. Currently he is a Patrol Sergeant at his agency and Team Leader for his large regional SWAT Team (2005 to present). Named *SWAT Officer of the Year* and *Police Officer of the Year* by the Benton County Sheriff's Office. Wayne serves as a Western Region Director for the National Tactical Officers Association (NTOA) and instructs in the NTOA's Command Cadre. He is a certified instructor in multiple disciplines and has had two published articles on SWAT procedures and operations in a national publication, "The Tactical Edge." Wayne holds a M.A. in Executive Leadership from Liberty University.
