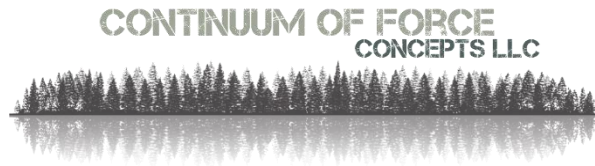

## Required and Recommended Equipment:

- Helmet with NVG mount (Shroud + Mounting arm, Wilcox or Norotos recommended), Mounting rails (Ops-Core ARC rail with bungees recommended), and helmet cover/loop Velcro for IR marking devices
- Night Vision Device (Monocular or binocular with all Basic Issued Items (BII) to include covers and sacrificial lenses)
- Eye protection (Clear lenses required)
- Ear protection (ARC-rail mount recommended, with radio download and microphone)
- Gas mask/Pro-mask
- BDU top/bottom (weather appropriate uniform)
- Weather-appropriate footwear
- Weather-appropriate outerwear (Shell jacket/pants, insulation, etc.)
- Gloves (Mechanix or similar)
- Knee/Elbow pads (Recommended)
- Duty belt
- Individual First-Aid Kit (IFAK/Blowout kit) per team SOP
- Tourniquet (TCCC Committee approved)
- Pistol magazine pouch x2
- Rifle magazine pouch x3
- Duty holster
- Body armor (Front/back hard plate WITH Velcro loop field on back of carrier)
- Pistol magazine x5
- Rifle magazine x5
- Issued radio with microphone and earpiece (if not using comm headset)
- Handheld flashlight/headlamp
- Issued Pistol with attached weapon light, Red Dot optic
- Issued Rifle with sling, optic, white light, IR laser/illuminator (PEQ-15 or comparable IR device) ENSURE day optic is zeroed prior to training!
- NLTA Conversion for issued rifle / pistol (UTM, Simunition, etc)
- Weapon cleaning kit with sectional cleaning rod and lubricant
- Multitool (Recommended)
- Notebook with pencil/pen/sharpie
- Water bottle/bladder
- 8ft of 1" tubular nylon
- Locking snap-link/carabineer
- Kit bag/weapon case (Recommended)
- Backpack/assault pack
