Course Overview:

This 24-hour course will combine classroom instruction with practical exercises. Considerations for serving narcotics warrants are the focus of the course. Topics covered include but are not limited to:

- Options for warrant service
- Narcotics warrant service planning & considerations
- Entry techniques
- Overview of UC/CS rescue
- Immediate action drills
- Incident debriefs
